- helps journalists gain a deeper understanding of gender-based violence in digital environments and report on it in a responsible and sensitive manner
- provides practical guidelines for identifying and exposing digital manipulation and disinformation related to gender issues
- empowers journalists to strengthen their knowledge of digital safety—both their own and that of their sources
- enables experienced journalists to pass on knowledge to younger colleagues and promote professional standards in newsroom reporting on digital violence
- offers a theoretical and analytical framework to help journalists recognize the broader social impact of media narratives and gender stereotypes
- encourages investigative journalism that uncovers the mechanisms behind technologyfacilitated violence and contributes to public debate and the protection of human rights online

- introduces young people to the topic of gender-based violence in digital environments and its impact on individuals and the community
- develops media literacy and helps youth think critically about the content they consume daily
- provides tools and techniques for identifying and debunking disinformation and manipulation online


